## **Visiting Faculty**

### **University of Chicago, Committee on Quantitative Methods in Social, Behavioral, and Health Sciences**

The Division of Social Sciences at the University of Chicago welcomes visiting faculty (open rank) to the new [Committee on Quantitative Methods in Social, Behavioral, and Health Sciences](#). This is a University-wide interdisciplinary group of distinguished scholars who are interested in improving methodological research and education in the study of populations and societies. The Committee, as an academic unit, has [faculty](#) members from the Social Sciences Departments, the Biological Sciences Departments, the Harris School of Public Policy, and the Department of Statistics. The new Committee will promote methodological learning across the disciplines through building an intellectual community of scholars and students who are engaged in quantitative research. The Committee supports, among its activities, a bi-weekly [Workshop on Quantitative Methods](#) that brings together leading methodologists from within and beyond the campus to learn about current breakthroughs in quantitative thinking.

For the 2018-2019 academic year, we welcome in particular visiting faculty who can contribute to our curriculum in the areas of psychometrics, multivariate statistics, formal modeling, or demographic techniques. Courses are open to advanced undergraduate students as well as master's and doctoral students. The University has a quarterly system (Autumn: Oct 1 – Dec 15; Winter: Jan 7 – Mar 23; Spring: Apr 1 – Jun 15). Visiting faculty, with authorization to work in the U.S., may choose to be in residence and offer one or two courses in any of the Quarters during the academic year. Compensation will be commensurate with experience.
