**Assistant Professor Position in Quantitative Psychology**

The Department of Psychology at McGill University invites applications for a tenure-track position at the Assistant Professor level in Quantitative Psychology with an anticipated starting date of September 1, 2019. The position may be in any area of theoretical or applied quantitative psychology. Applicants are expected to have a doctorate in quantitative psychology, psychometrics, or closely related fields at the time of appointment. Applicants should show evidence of research productivity and the potential to obtain external funding, as well as a strong commitment to and aptitude for high quality teaching at both undergraduate and graduate levels.

Review of applications will begin **September 10, 2018**. Applicants should arrange for the following materials to be sent in electronic format to [quant-search@psych.mcgill.ca](mailto:quant-search@psych.mcgill.ca): 1) curriculum vitae; 2) a statement of research interests; 3) a statement of teaching philosophy and experience, and evidence of teaching excellence (if available); 4) relevant reprints or pre-prints; and 5) three confidential letters of recommendation.

If the successful candidate satisfies the specific eligibility conditions of the program, the candidate may be supported by the University for nomination to a Tier 2 Canada Research Chair (CRC) in Quantitative Psychology, which provides protected time for research within a full-time academic appointment. Tier 2 Chairs are for emerging researchers (individuals who are no more than 10 years from having earned their highest degree). However, career interruptions (e.g. maternity or parental leave, extended sick leave, clinical training, family care, etc.) may be taken into consideration. CRC nominations within the university are highly competitive.

McGill University is an international and research intensive University, with an exceptional undergraduate and graduate student body, which enjoys collegial governance, extensive employee benefits (health, dental, life insurance and pension) and co-operative research and teaching ties with other Montreal universities. McGill is centrally located between Mount Royal Park and downtown Montreal, which is a safe, lively, culturally diverse, cosmopolitan and bilingual (French/English) city, with a high quality cultural life and publically funded health care. Moreover, the psychology department has recently moved into a brand-new state-of-the-art research facility. Importantly, McGill is an English language institution; knowledge of French is not required but would be an asset.
